At-a-glance

Media and technology are coming together to such an extent that it is often difficult to distinguish the two areas. At the same time, jobs in both film and TV are becoming increasingly multi-disciplined. Involving digital film-making, and an understanding of the technology behind it and new media technologies, this course will position you to thrive in the digital age.

During the three year course students will learn all the key film making skills from basic video production through to advanced film production techniques. These crucial skills are backed up with advanced modules in video editing, cinematography, animation and audio recording and mixing. This is combined with industry standard film production and post-production equipment and software. Giving Film Production Technology graduates the employment edge in the film and television industry.

Year 1 covers film production, image processing and design together with video editing, scriptwriting, history of film technology and audio for production. These core skills continue through each year in more and more detail.

In years 2 and 3 you will study High Definition video production, film making, editing, cinematography, audio production, mixing and design, animation and other key post production skills like compositing and match moving. All taught by a staff team made up of industry practitioners and film makers.
