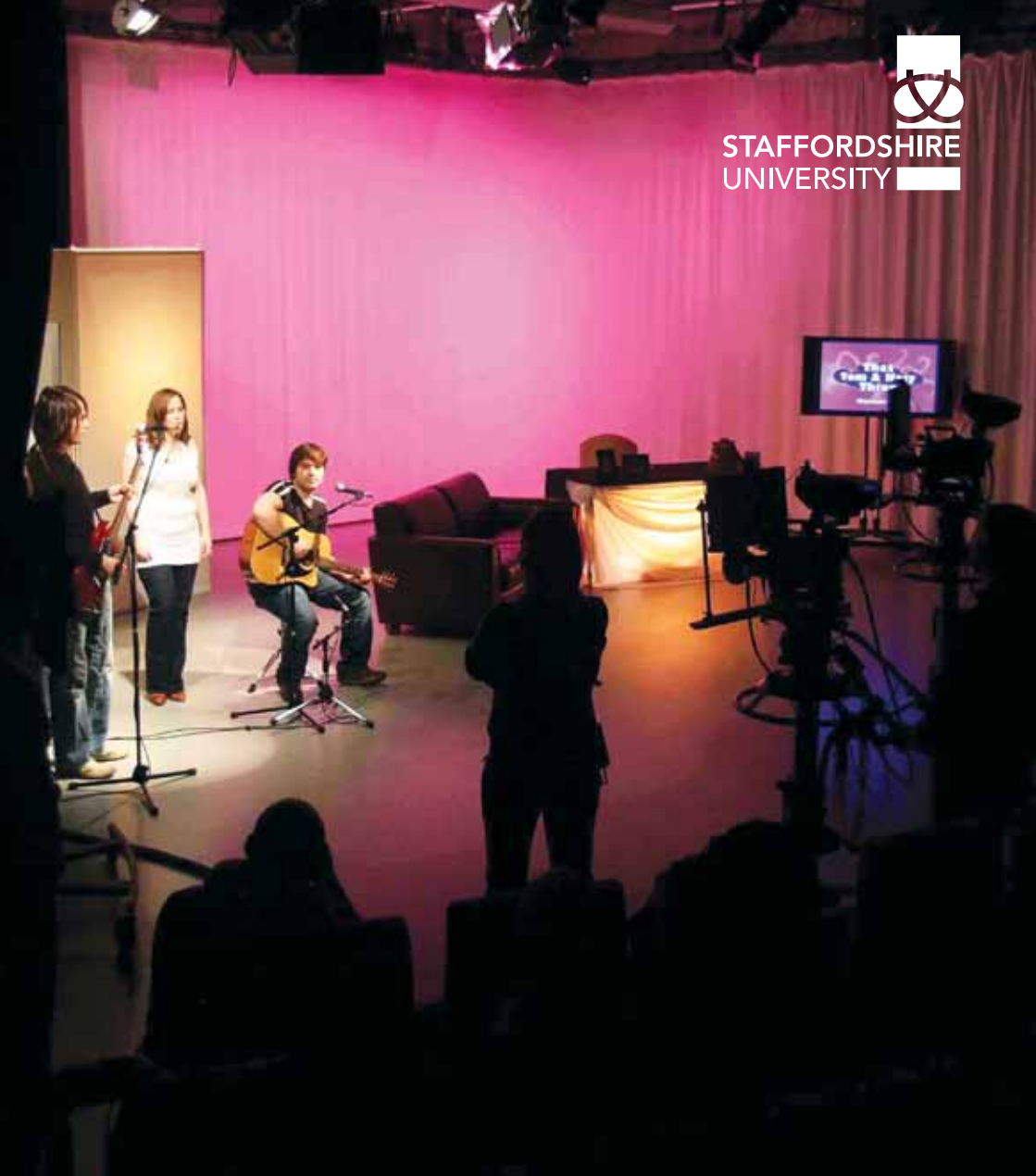

At-a-glance

This course will prepare you for a variety of creative, technical or administrative positions in film, television, music and the new media industries. Combining technology with the creative aspects of scripting, video and music production, you will gain an enviable mix of technology skills that are in demand by employers.

You will study digital video production, the creative applications that relate to the scripting and making of television programmes, music production and recording, and the technologies of electronics and communications. Using the latest industrial technology high-definition digital filming, Final Cut Pro and Avid non-linear post-production editing and mastering are important components of the course.

Year One covers transferable skills such as film technology, scriptwriting, Internet, Photoshop, the history of film technology and audio processing. There is an opportunity to study writing for the screen across Levels 1 and 2.

In Years One and Two, you will study digital high-definition filming, digitisation, compression, digital processing, video and sound processing, 3D scene creation, studio production technology, music production and recording and multimedia authoring. You will use industry standard non-linear Final Cut and Avid editing packages and post-production software that includes Pro-Tools, After Effects, combustion and DVD authoring and have the opportunity to learn how to run our industry-leading 125-seat high-definition TV centre.

Over the period of the course, you will produce a large number of high quality finished films to demonstrate your ability in writing for the screen, your film-making, music production, creativity and technological skills.
