Understanding disputes and dispute resolution

Gary Attle and members of the education and public law team will host a discussion forum on Monday 19 January 2009 at Mills & Reeve's London office.

The purpose of this seminar is to take stock of the various approaches to resolving student and university-related disputes, looking to deepen an understanding of how these different procedures may be used effectively in a university context. We will consider the emerging role of the Office of the Independent Adjudicator, mediation, judicial review and formal court-based mechanisms.
