The final destinations of graduates will be many and various, depending on their areas of experience and ambitions but will include professional practice, consultancy, enterprise generation, retail, teaching and higher levels of research.

MA International Policy and Diplomacy by Distance Learning

Stoke campus
Faculty of Arts, Media and Design

This distance learning MA has been developed with strong vocational elements based around three substantial core courses. These are:

- International Relations in the Twentieth Century
- Diplomacy and a Global World
- Global Policy Analysis

These courses will be delivered fully on-line with the option of visiting the UK for additional workshops or for a 12 week period joining the students studying by attendance.

The distance learning programme is highly structured but with the facility for considerable on-line interaction with staff and other students. Some of this interaction may be scheduled to be in 'real time'.

Weekly tasks and readings are used as a basis for engagement in discussion, within groups of students or through on-line seminar presentations to the class. Substantial researched essays provide the main basis for assessment.

Increasing emphasis is being placed on the importance of mentoring in workplace, community and voluntary settings. Organisations of all kinds are recognising the benefits of mentoring as a way of supporting workers in meeting individual and organisational objectives and priorities. The mentoring programme has been developed specifically to respond to these needs. It aims to meet the continuing professional development and life-long learning needs of people engaged in the mentoring role. It offers a learning experience which reflects the working environment in which you are involved.

The modules will provide you with knowledge and understanding of the issues involved in mentoring and the skills that you can use in mentoring practice in your workplace. The programme content and delivery has been devised in consultation with professionals from the health, education, community and voluntary sectors and is taught by academics that have interests in mentoring and related areas. Three different routes through the programme are available dependent upon students' own background and experience and the time commitment they can make to the course.

Foundation Degree in Youth and Community Work*

Designed in consultation with the voluntary sector and collaboration with statutory youth services and the National Youth Agency, the new Foundation Degree in Youth and Community Work has been designed with the employed (paid or voluntary) youth or community worker in mind.

It leads to JNC professional youth and community worker qualifications. Taught modules and fieldwork placements create an environment of learning in which students can fully integrate theory with practice. This is the award for youth and community workers who wish to gain qualified status while remaining in employment and thus enhancing their career prospects.

The course provides all the key skills required to be an effective youth and community worker and teaching emphasises the core principles on which youth work is based (education, equality, empowerment and participation).
