2 What is the format and how do I complete the questionnaire?

You then have to indicate your level of agreement or disagreement with each statement on a scale of "Strongly Disagree" to "Completely Agree".

You are assessed on how your answers align to the Competencies and Values Framework (CVF).

4 What is the Competencies and Values Framework (CVF)?

The CVF sets out nationally recognised behaviours and values, which provides clear expectations for everyone working in policing:

- Respect and empathy
- Courage
- Public Service

- We are Innovative and open-minded
- We are emotionally aware
- We take ownership
- We collaborate
- We Support and inspire
- We analyse critically
