FACILITIES



£30m Science Centre

Our £30m Science Centre is a hive of exploration, discovery and eureka moments. It contains specialist labs that delve into all areas of psychology. Here you'll practise and refine your practitioner skills, preparing you for a career when you graduate.

Simulation facilities

Through a combination of equipment and software, we can realistically recreate environments and conditions that would not be safe or possible to create in real life. By immersing you in a controlled environment we give you the chance to practise your skills and test hypotheses safely.

Counselling suites

Our Counselling Suites have recording ability and are perfect for practising counselling skills or conducting interviews with research participants.





Human Sciences Suite (HSS)

The Human Sciences Suite hosts a collection of adjoining research laboratories dedicated to psychophysiological research on human participants. This suite includes our EEG, pain, cardiovascular and clinical biochemisty labs. The suite also plays host to a full range of software for experimental design, build, acquisition and analysis.

Eye tracking cubicles

Tracking Cubicles feature desktop and portable eye trackers that allow us to track participants' visual attention during psychology experiments.



Observation and Cognitive Suite

The Observation and Cognitive Suite has digital video cameras and microphones to carry out research with focus groups, interviews and behavioural observations. The cognitive suite of laboratories is a purpose-built set of five individual testing rooms linked to a central control room.
